'Just Add Water' - plus Destination Imagination

Liz Malanaphy told the group about two community efforts – first her “Just Add Water” education program held at the Phipps Center for the Arts in the summer, and then details on the Destination Imagination teams active in Hudson. Liz has taught a few dozen age 8-13 children about the river and water during the summers, and looks forward to a day and a way where all ages of the community can participate. She stressed a pair of important concepts - “Creativity” and “Connections”. Another key thought was her observation that “There will always be somewhere more beautiful than where you are, so don't try to find a place more beautiful, but find the beauty in the place where you live.”

On the Destination Imagination front, we learned that 25 different teams are sponsored in the area, with parents volunteering to handle coaching of all the teams. Hudson teams have had a remarkable run of success, with 7 teams through the years going to the international competition, some over multiple years. One team took 3 titles, with two other teams winning the international title, as well.
