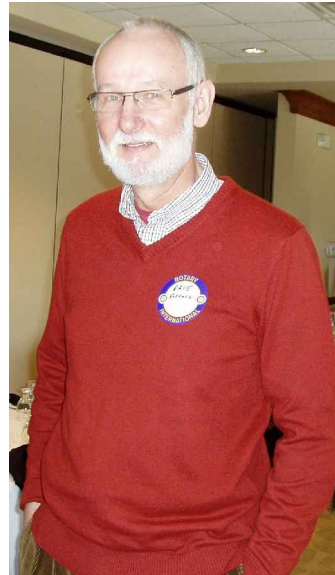

Program – Kinnikinnic River Land Trust

Dave Fodroczi retired last fall after 33 years in public service jobs, most recently 22 years with Saint Croix County, but is busier than ever, since he jumped right in as executive director of the Kinnikinnic River Land Trust. Dave was immediately attracted by the mission statement of the organization, since all of the words and thoughts there were consistent with his own beliefs.

We learned about the “good bugs” in the Kinni, 23 posted access sites, the “weeping wall” which is 200 feet long, record warm weather which enabled a canoe trip on New Year's Eve, plus the difference between oak savannah and goat prairie. The trout population ranges between 2,000 and 5,000 fish per mile ... hmmm – that's up to about 1 fish every foot!
